



Dwip Unnayan Songstha Launches Medical Camp for Noakhali Flood Victims

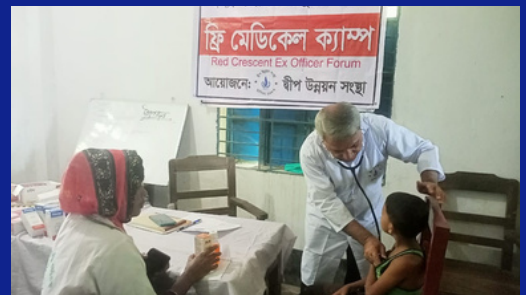
Noakhali, September 23, 2024 – Dwip Unnayan Songstha has taken the initiative to provide essential healthcare services to those affected by the recent devastating floods in Noakhali. As part of this service, Dr. Hasan Mahmud, a specialist in public health with extensive experience working with the Red Crescent, joined the medical team on September 22, 2024, to treat flood-affected individuals.

Yesterday, Dr. Mahmud provided care at a medical camp in Harani Union, Hatiya Upazila, alongside paramedic Atikullah Belal and volunteer Nasima Begum. Today, he is continuing his services at the Kanchan Bazar branch in Subarnachar Upazila.

Reflecting on his experience at the Harani camp, Dr. Mahmud said, “Our team treated 151 individuals, mostly women and children, suffering from conditions such as allergic dermatitis, scabies, ringworm, pneumonia, anemia, diarrhea, and mental health issues like anxiety and depression. Among the children, malnutrition, particularly low weight, was prevalent.”

Devastating Floods Affect Millions in Eastern Bangladesh

The recent floods in eastern Bangladesh have affected around 5.6 million people. The worst-hit districts include Feni, Noakhali, and Lakshmipur. In response, Dwip Unnayan Songstha has launched free medical camps in 12 of the most affected areas, providing free medicines and healthcare to those in need.
